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






of just having fun and vibing out without there having to be some perfectly polished tune at the end."

You have released across quite a few dance genres, from grime



#### to garage to drum & bass, what kind of sounds are you working on now?

"Right now, I'm very heavily into drum & bass. I'm really loving high-energy club rollers but I am also really excited about this 140 wave that is happening. I have a lot of history in the 140bpm territory, as my first main genre was grime. So, on hearing this new fusion of dubstep influenced sounds, I'm super inspired and have got some of my own 140s in the making."

#### Which production techniques are you interested in at the moment? Is there something new in particular you're putting into your compositions?

"Something I recently introduced to my production techniques is volume shaping. For the last five or so years, I've been scratching my head on how to side-chain my bass and kicks correctly. Since I've started using the LFO tool to manually automate the areas that need space, I've been much happier with my mixes."



## **Taking Centre Stage**

Electrotec's new Stage One speakers hit the main stage

J Mag Tech went on a road trip earlier this summer to California Newport Beach in fact - to check in with Electrotec Audio, a new company with a new wireless speaker, coming from a legacy background in pro audio installations.

The founder of the company Rikki Farr has been a leading figure in full-scale stadium tours and sound installations. His résumé is immensely impressive - putting on the original Isle Of Wight Festival, concerts on the beach in Rio De Janeiro to over a million people - and he has worked with legendary artists such as Bob Marley, Prince, Guns N' Roses and Tom Petty, the list goes on! His credentials speak for themselves. So, when we got the call to see what the company was up to in its facility over in Cali, we jumped at the chance, intrigued as we were when Electrotec explained that it had created "the world's best wireless speaker", a bold statement that required us to hear for ourselves.

The speaker in question is called Stage One, a portable wireless unit adopting various wireless technologies (SKAA and Bluetooth 5.3), as well as a host of "industry first" innovations (100-hour rechargeable battery system) to deliver something that is quite different into the marketplace. After years of refining and tuning speakers for the pro stage, Electrotec has decided to move into the DJ/ portable sound market, with its first product aimed specifically to fulfil the needs of both the pro and the consumer market. The Stage One sits happily in both worlds, for DJs or venues that require a serious set-up with wireless operation as its main motivation, or for anybody seeking a very good speaker for a more relaxed home/portable setting, again with the wireless USP as the headline act. One of its slogans around the speaker, "bringing pro to the consumer", embodies that ethos. We often talk about the need for "good sound", and everyone should be able to experience this. In a world where some think loud is good (which is definitely not the case), Electrotec wants to demonstrate that with the Stage

One, you can get high grade sound without compromise, by creating a speaker that sounds great - and don't get us wrong, can also do loud. We witnessed this in the studio listening session and the open-air field demonstration the company put on for us, and to double down on what we've already said, the Stage One does loud but, more importantly, does quality. Listening to the Stage One, we were impressed that the audio delivery offers more than being just a glorified wireless speaker that can be taken on the road for that ad hoc party. What the listener/user gets is a sound that is in-keeping with the sort of response that would be expected from a reference grade monitor/ speaker or a serious pro sound installation.

The speaker is made for those looking for the highest quality audio performance for their music. It supports USB-C charging and playback, a 3.5mm input and XLR connectivity, making it versatile and compatible with a wide range of devices. The inclusion



of the SKAA technology also allows users to link up to five speakers wirelessly, creating a seamless and immersive audio environment.

For professional DJs and enthusiasts alike, the Stage One offers low latency, prograde outputs suitable for DJ gear, mixers, microphones and instruments. This feature ensures that whether you're in a studio, at a gig, or just enjoying music at home, the sound quality remains pristine and consistent. The team has worked hard to get this level of quality, from its robust design to its powerful sound output. We were shown various different versions of drivers and amp configurations that the team had created and tested before arriving at the right ones for the speaker; we were also shown the level of detail that goes into the tuning of the

speaker to achieve a sound that offers clarity, depth and accuracy across a wide frequency range across all volume levels. We also managed (to sneak around the facility) to get a glimpse of the future of where Electrotec Audio is going with its speaker(s), and were privy to a few trade secrets. Without giving too much away, don't be surprised if there are more additions to the Stage One in the near future... and with that, be prepared to be blown away by what is to come.

Electrotec Audio's Stage One delivers a statement of what portable audio can achieve. It is built around an impressive feature set, with the 100-hour battery life, and the legacy of a seasoned audio professional (Rikki Farr and his team). We can see the Stage One becoming one of those go-to choices for DJs as well as music lovers.
